GKU Scholars

GraceKids University Scholars is a set of self-paced Bible memorization programs encouraging kids to read through the Bible and hide God's Word in their hearts.

GKU Scholars is designed for kids in elementary grades. (See **Little Scholars** program created for preschoolers on the preschool section of this website.) Kids earn awards for each program completed. (At Grace Church kids earn an engraved medal and a permanent star in the kids' foyer.) We challenge every child to complete the first program, Scholars, by the time they graduate from the children's ministry. Kids can also complete 4 additional programs. The child who completes all 5 programs will have read through two different Bibles and memorized 305 verses.

The children's department can create a Scholars notebook, or make one for each grade level. Insert a page for each child who begins the program and record their progress. When a child masters an objective, he recites it to a teacher at the end of a service and it is recorded on his notebook page. Record the date each individual objective is completed and give the child a small certificate and a piece of candy. A child earns large awards (such as a medal and a permanent star) after completing the entire program. When needed, start a notebook for each of the additional programs.

Included in the programs are three service projects that your church creates for your kids to do. At Grace Church, our service projects include serving on the church Welcome Team, and other projects to help our church family and community.

It's so rewarding to see kids lined up after a service to recite scripture! Kids will rise to our expectations, and many will want to accomplish these Bible reading and memorization goals! Just think, these kids will have God's Word hidden in their hearts the rest of their lives to bring truth, wisdom, guidance, comfort, and peace!

READ THROUGH THE BIBLE

Read the *Day by Day Kid's Bible* by Karyn Henley, written for ages 7-12. Kids can read the Bible in one year by reading 7 min. a day. The Bible, which is a chronological Bible, shows you what to read each day. A parent could read to the child, or the child can read independently. Also, you don't have to wait until Jan. 1 to begin reading a Bible like this, but you can begin any time! Your child does not have to complete the Bible in one year—you could take more time if that works better for your family.

THE STORY OF HEARTS (The Plan of Redemption)

- **1.** In the beginning, God created Adam and Eve. They had happy hearts. They were close to God.
- 2. Then, Adam and Eve sinned. They disobeyed God when they ate the fruit God told them not to eat. Their hearts turned sad. They were no longer close to God.
- **3.** Adam and Eve had kids, and their kids had kids, and so on. They had sad hearts, too, because they disobeyed God. No one was close to God.
- **4.** God was very sad because the people had sad hearts and no one was close to Him.
- **5.** God sent His Son Jesus to earth so that He would grow up and take away our sins and our sad hearts.
- **6.** Jesus had a happy heart. Jesus was perfect---He never disobeyed God.
- **7.** Then, Jesus died on the cross. Jesus took our sins and sad hearts on the cross.
- **8.** Three days later Jesus rose from the dead. Later He went back up to heaven. The people who believed in Jesus and asked Jesus to come into their heart got happy hearts and were close to God.
- **9.** If you ask Jesus into your heart, you will get a happy heart and you will go to heaven someday!

HOW TO LEAD A FRIEND TO CHRIST (including The Salvation Prayer)

- The purpose of this objective is to learn how to lead a friend to Christ. You do not need to actually lead a friend to Christ in order to complete this objective.
- Memorize the following information and recite it to a teacher, including the words of The Salvation Prayer. (The Salvation Prayer is based on Rom. 10:9.)

A. First, tell your friend about Jesus.

- 1. Tell how much Jesus loves us.
- 2. Tell how Jesus died on the cross to take away our sins.
- 3. Tell how Jesus wants to live in our heart and be our best friend.
- 4. Tell how a person who has Jesus in his heart will go to heaven someday.
- 5. Or, you could tell the Story of Hearts.
- B. **Second**, ask your friend if he wants to invite Jesus into his heart. If he says yes:
- C. Third, lead your friend in a Salvation Prayer.

Ask your friend to say the words, one part at a time, after you.

The Salvation Prayer

Father, in the name of Jesus,

I ask Jesus to come inside my heart.

I say Jesus is my Lord.

I believe God raised Jesus from the dead.

I will go to heaven someday because Jesus lives inside me.

In Jesus' name, Amen.
